

Oregon DEQ would like to add the following caveat to its CAA data:

Oregon recently discovered that "out of compliance" status in EPA's database was not being removed from sources in a timely manner when they returned to compliance. Some sources that became "out of compliance" as a result of failed inspections/source tests/semi-annual compliance certifications remained out of compliance in EPA's database for an inaccurate, extended length of time. Oregon Department of Environmental Quality recently discovered this problem and is addressing it in current reports to EPA's database. While historic compliance history in EPA's database cannot be changed, ECHO provides a rolling three-year picture that will become more accurate over time as old data drops off.
